mess. Speak-ing of Greg, he also gets a big thanks for fixing the front door when it literally blew off its hinges during the big wind-


storm at the end of last month.

All those things had to go wrong at the same time for this to happen, and then you have to add a child leaving the faucet running; just slowly enough to not be obvious. It was the

perfect disaster.

So what am I grateful for? The child. The child who left the water running, Wiping his nose with the back of his hand as he left the room, completely oblivious to the chain of events he had set in motion. Because that child was here.

There is a saying that goes something like this: 'Someday the Christians will be gone and the devil will get the churches, so let's give him churches that are well-used.'


