## A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

### Faith, Fear, and Frustration

Faith is so easy when we read about it. We see David face Goliath, or Daniel go into the Lions' Den, and we say, "There is our lesson on faith." Except God considers faith a lab class. You don't know it when you've learned it from a book. You know it when you've put it into practice.

Case in point: Our building program. Six months ago we considered the building we wanted and the funds we had, and we prayed. We concluded God wanted us to start, and trust that funds would come in. Now, our expenses are quickly catching up to our balance (see mailer page), and we have to decide how we will respond.

Fear is a good option. "Oh no! We don't have enough money to finish. What will we do? Boo Hoo." Get over it cry baby. That's not our response.

Frustration also works. "Who thought we should do this now? Somebody made a mistake! I'm putting on my angry face." Sorry. Wrong again.

Faith is the correct answer; and let me answer for us all when I say it is the response we will make.

Faith doesn't say it won't be difficult, but hat God is greater than the difficulty. And frankly, when it is difficult is when you should get excited; because that is our opportunity to see God work.

When we read of David or Daniel or Joseph or Joshua or Paul living by faith in difficult circumstances, we see how God works, but we haven't yet made the transition to see God working now. When we

choose to be faithful and see God working in our own lives, that is when faith grows.

Nehemiah is, for lack of a better way to put it, the patron saint of building projects. When he came to Jerusalem, the walls had been in ruins for about 120 years. The people had been back in the land for about 50, but no one had rebuild the walls because the task

was just too daunting. But Nehemiah was determined to build.

He faced opposition from people who opposed the Israelites because they were Israelites. He faced the threat of armed resistance, but would not be stopped. His response? "So neither I, my brothers, my servants, nor the men of the guard who followed me, none of us removed our clothes, each took his weapon even to the water (the bathroom)" (Neh 4:23). They faced financial struggles, as there was a drought. He faced attempts to distract and even assassinate him.

Nehemiah's building project is summed up in this phrase: "He worked as if he didn't' pray, and he prayed as if he didn't work." And the project was summed up this way: "(Our enemies) recognized that this work had been accomplished with the help of our God" (Neh. 6:16).

Now it's our turn. As it's beginning to look like this project is beyond us, it is time to get excited and work hard. We can't do it on our own, but that's not a problem. What it is is an opportunity to watch our faith grow.
