Lessons from a Bad Guy

King Ahab is one of the most intriguing bad guys of the Bible. He is Elijah's nemesis and is summed up with these words, *"Ahab the son of Omri did evil in the sight of the LORD more than all who were before him"* (1 Kings 16:30). And *"Surely there was no one like Ahab who sold himself to do evil in the sight of the LORD, because Jezebel his wife incited him"* (1 Kings 21:25). I guess you could say he wasn't a bad guy, he was a Bad Guy. Still, I think I might have liked him, and maybe we can learn a lesson or two from his life.

First, I don't think it was so much that he was bad as that he didn't care about God. He met Princess Jezebel, and she was a babe, who worshiped another God. God wasn't important to Ahab, so idol worship was not a big deal to him. He cared about babes, so that was a big deal to him. His priorities would fit well in the modern world.

Second, he was immature. When a man named Naboth wouldn't sell him a vineyard, he *"came into his house sullen and vexed...and lay down on his bed and turned away his face and ate no food"* (1 Kings 21:4). Poor baby.

Third, he had no moral character. When Jezebel heard why he was pouting, she had Naboth murdered and gave the property to Ahab. Ahab wasn't party to the murder, but he took the land.

He allowed his wife to do pretty much whatever she wanted. She promoted worship of Baal and Asherah. He allowed her

to kill prophets of the LORD. At least where she was concerned, he had no character.

So why do I think I might have liked him? Because he was a warrior, and fearless in battle. The king of Aram came up against him with a huge army and demanded tribute. He agreed to give it. When it became apparent Aram didn't actually want tribute. But

war, they threatened to reduce his city to dust. He replied, *"Let not him who girds on his armor boast like him who takes it off."* God gave Ahab the victory that day (and the next time the two kings met); but Ahab had the courage to go into battle against a far greater army. Even when Ahab died, it was in battle, standing in his chariot and bleeding out from his wounds, facing the enemy.

He also was able to repent. Elijah confronted Ahab after the incident with Naboth. *"It came about when Ahab heard these words, that he tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and fasted, and he lay in sackcloth and went about despondently"* (1 Kings 21:27).

Some lessons from the life of Ahab: 1. It's not enough to know about God, you have to care about Him. If you don't care, the knowledge won't help you. 2. Don't throw pity parties. 3. Take responsibility for your actions, and don't be a party to someone else's sins. 4. When you sin, repent. 5. Courage is admirable, but it won't save you. When you die, you'll still be dead.

First Kings, 17-22. Read up on Ahab. See what I missed and what else you can learn from this bad guy.

We have a new electric drum set to be in use soon. This is something we’ve been discussing for years, but the ability to run the drums through the sound board should be a great asset for sound quality with streaming the service, and that made it easier for us to move ahead with the decision.

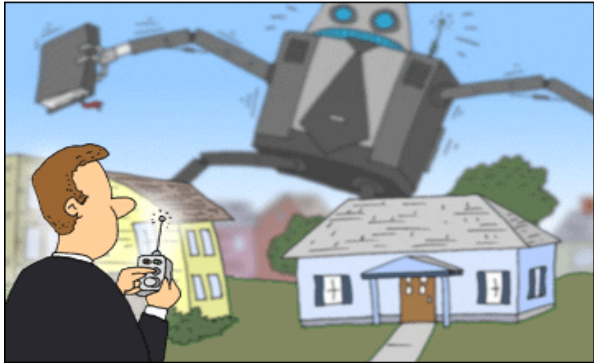
